






GENERAL INFO:

The 3,452-acre Codorus State Park is in the rolling hills of southern York County. The 1,275-acre Lake Marburg has 26 miles of shoreline and is a reststop for migrating waterfowl and shorebirds. The lake is also popular with sailboaters and motorboaters. Anglers love the lake for warm water fishing and can also fish Codorus Creek for trout. Picnicking, swimming in the pool and camping are popular activities.

Weather: Typical April highs, 45-55 F. Typical lows, 25-45 F






LOCATION: 74 Miles away. Friday, 2 ½ + hours; Sunday, 1 ½ hours

The park is in York County, three miles east of Hanover, PA.


From Northern Virginia, take I-270 N to Germantown, MD. Take exit 16 onto Hwy 27 North to Westminster, MD. Turn left onto West Main Street. Then, turn right onto Pennsylvania Ave (Rte 97 N) and drive approx. 3 miles. Turn right onto Rte 496. After 7.2 miles, Rte 496 turns into Wentz Road. Continue 2.5 miles across the PA/MD border and then take a slight left onto Gier Rd. After 56 ft., turn right onto Glenville Rd/Wentz Rd and travel .3 miles. Then turn left onto State Route 3058 (Blue Hill Rd). Drive 4.4 miles then turn left onto PA-216 W/Blooming Grove Rd; park entrance is on right.






