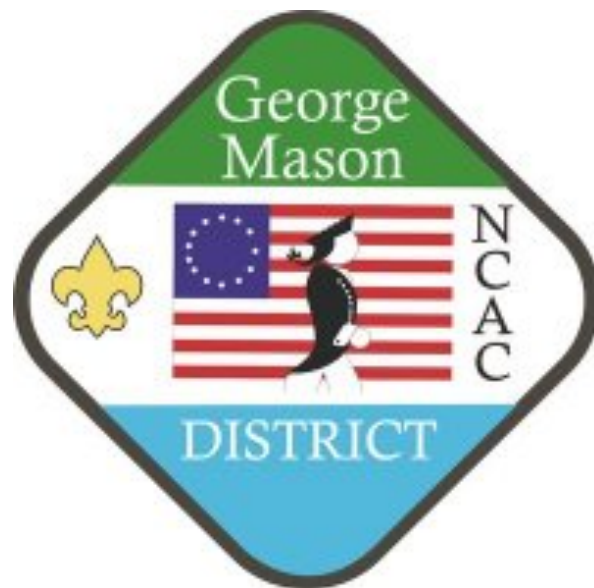

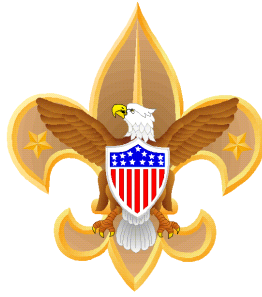


Shooting Sports Extravaganza

DEADLINES:

Register to attend (sign roster or contact ASM Zampella) NLT Tuesday, 3/12/13

Deliver permission slips and payment to Julie Custer NLT Friday, 3/15/13



This year's Spring Camporee will be a fun and challenging weekend for both Boy Scouts and Webelos. There will be open shooting ranges where Scouts may try their hand at various types of shooting sports. The Patrol competition is designed for groups of 4-5 Scouts, consists of five events; Skeet Shooting, an Air Rifle Obstacle Course, Field Archery, Long Range Archery and Slingshots. Additionally, there will be Air Rifles, Archery, BB guns, Action Archery, and Tomahawk Throwing. Campsite contests include Dutch Oven cooking and a flagpole/campsite entrance lashings event. Come join us for this fun and exciting weekend!

WHERE: Camp William B Snyder, 6100 Antioch Road, Haymarket, VA 20169.

WHEN: Check-in on Friday, March 22, 2013 from 1700 hours until 2000 hours. The Camporee will run until 1100 on Sunday morning. A mandatory safety briefing is scheduled for 2100 hours Friday night.

HOW: Troop 349 scouts must register to attend (sign roster or contact ASM Zampella) NLT Tuesday, March 12, 2013. Permission slips (troop, a special Spring Camporee permission slip and firearm/archery authorization form) must be delivered with payment to Julie Custer NLT Friday, March 15, 2013.

COST: Total cost (district and troop fees) is \$40 per scout and \$25 per adult. Adults who volunteered IN ADVANCE (by March 15) to work a station at the Camporee are FREE; you can contact ASM Zampella before March 15. Webelos attending with the troop will be charged \$10 and their accompanying adults will be charged \$5. Fees include an event patch, program supplies, ammunition, equipment, campsites, restrooms, showers and awards.

CAMPSITE: Each Unit participating in the Camporee should prepare a Dutch oven desert for judging at 1900 on Saturday. This is a major score in the overall competition. Additionally, each Unit should lash together an entrance structure featuring a functioning flagpole. These will be judged separately.

PATROL COMPETITION EVENTS: The Patrol Competition is designed to provide an opportunity for the Scouts to sample several types of shooting sports in unusual contexts while having fun and contributing to the whole of each patrol. Four to five scouts per patrol should each specialize in one or two events, the scores of which will be totaled toward an aggregate score. One Patrol Scorecard annotated with all the acquired scores during the competitive events should be turned-in at the end of the day of competition. WEBELOS can participate with Slingshots.

- **Skeet Range** - The Scout will have 12 clay pigeons to break using whatever number of shots that can be fired during the flight of each bird. One point per broken pigeon.
- **Field Archery** - The Scout will traverse on foot a course of four targets shooting four arrows at each animal-faced target. Points will be acquired from the face-value denoted by the placement of each arrow in the target.
- **Air Rifle Obstacle Course** - The Scout will traverse on foot a course of obstacles distributed between five pellet-trap targets. Upon arriving at a shooting station he will fire five shots at each target. Points will be tallied based upon the placement of shots.
- **Long-range Archery** - The Scout will have six arrows to shoot at each of two targets, one at a distance of 30 yards and the other at 60 yards. Points will be acquired from the face-value denoted by the placement of each arrow in the target.
- **Slingshots** - The Scout will shoot five metal balls at each of two targets located within Fort Pinewood. Points will be acquired from the face-value denoted by the placement of each shot in the target.

UNIT CONTESTS: Complete each task by dinner and lunch on Saturday, respectively.

- **Dutch Oven Cooking:** Each Unit participating in the Camporee should prepare a Dutch oven desert for judging at 1900 on Saturday. Type of desert is completely of their choosing.
- **Camp Entrance Lashing Project:** Each Unit should lash together an entrance structure featuring a functioning flagpole. The entrance should have enough structure to be sturdy and at least two Scouts could pass through the entrance together. Flagpole must support the unit's flag.

OPEN FIRING RANGES: While the troops are lashing together their entrances and Patrols are busy undergoing their competitive events Scouts and WEBELOS not involved in those events may sample several other shooting sports events. Upon completion of the competitive events those ranges will be available in an open context if Adult staff are available to safely run the ranges.

- **Air Rifle Range** - Scouts will have the opportunity to shoot Sporter Air Rifles on this range employing nearly all the skills necessary to shoot .22 Small Bore firearms. Range is expected to be limited to four shooters at a time.
- **BB Gun Range** - WEBELOS and Boy Scouts will have the opportunity to shoot BB Guns on this range. Several Scouts can shoot at a time.
- **Action Archery Range** - WEBELOS and Boy Scouts will have the opportunity to shoot various moving targets at this range challenging their ability to put an arrow on target. Range is expected to be limited to four to six archers at a time.
- **Archery Pavilion Range** - WEBELOS and Boy Scouts will have the opportunity to shoot at a traditional camp archery range employing all the skills necessary to shoot in competition. Several Scouts can shoot at a time.
- **Tomahawk Range** - WEBELOS and Boy Scouts will have the opportunity to throw tomahawks at log face targets practicing a skill handed down to us from the Old Frontier. Range is expected to be limited to four to six throwers at a time.
