

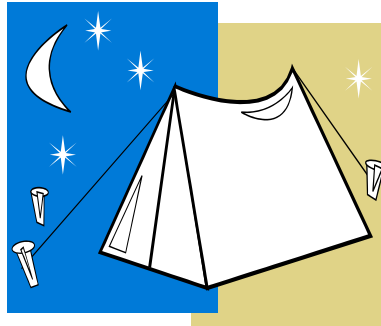

We will need to navigate a course and compete in four events in a timed competition. Key elements are going to be Orienteering, map & compass skills, and first aid. While the District is keeping the details secret, but we suspect that lashings and knots also may be part of the competition. Patrol spirit (cheers) and teamwork will be graded. There will be a cooking completion by patrol—including the Adult Patrol.

This is also an important recruiting event for the troop. We will have a daytime visit from Web I's and overnight visit on Saturday night with Web II's. We will also erect the famous Monkey Bridge (and need someone with a truck to help transport it).

For the Order of the Arrow, there will be an OA Cracker Barrel and opportunity for the OA Brotherhood.

Planned Activities are as follows:

Friday Night, we'll grab dinner on the road and arrive and make camp Friday night.

The District has not yet announced the full program, but has told us that it will follow last year's program, which included two levels of competitions: Troop and Patrol. Awards are to be presented at the closing Ceremony on Sunday.

Troops will compete for Honor Troop and two runner-up positions in three events: Gateway Design, Campsite, and Cooking Competition. We will use our pioneering and lashing skills to construct a troop campsite gateway. We will also be evaluated on our camp area layout, neatness, and safety. We will need to prepare an appetizer, main course, or dessert for delivery to the Staff HQ on Saturday evening for judging.

As always, there will be campfire songs or skits to be judged.

10. At the traffic circle, continue straight to stay on **US-50 W/Lee Jackson Memorial Hwy** 0.4 mi
11. At the traffic circle, continue straight onto **US-50/Lee Jackson Memorial Hwy** 0.4 mi
12. At the traffic circle, continue straight onto **US-50 W/Lee Jackson Memorial Hwy** 1.7 mi
13. Turn right onto **Snickersville Turnpike** 4.6 mi
14. Turn right onto **State Route 733/Lime Kiln Rd** 0.9 mi
15. Turn left onto **State Route 763/Step toe Hill Rd**
