This campout will be a good opportunity for our younger and new Scouts to focus on their Tenderfoot, Second and First Class requirements (including knot-tying, first aid, cooking and the proper handling of the knife, axe and saw), and for our older and more experienced First Class, Star and Eagle Scouts to teach these requirements, as well as develop an appreciation for the benefits that come from teammanship and proper, sustained training. The aim is to get comfortable with camping in cold weather conditions, and to fulfill any outstanding rank advancement requirements before the end of the year. The cost of this campout is \$30 per person.
